### **PRESENTATION**

The Specialization course in Classical Osteopathy is a course taught in a model format following the models taught in England, Spain and Canada with an **integrated internship for a period of 3 months**.

The two finalists\* who achieve the best results will receive a scholarship of €250 to attend other courses taught by IPOC.

Note: all classes taught in English have simultaneous translation into Portuguese.

### **OBJECTIVES**

- Integration of the Concepts and Principles of Osteopathy according to its founders: Andrew T. Still & John M. Littlejohn.
- Understanding Physiology in the Function vs. Function equation. Structure addressing the biomechanics of lines and arches according to Littlejohn.
- Obtain the mechanical physiological reasoning that exists "behind" the pathology.
- Enable the trainee to evaluate the patient and apply Body Adjustment, in practice, at a safe level of competence.

### **RECIPIENTS**

Osteopaths, Physiotherapists, Occupational Therapists and Doctors.

\* A scholarship if the finalist group is made up of less than 15 students.

### **CERTIFICATION**

Students with good performance: **Certificate of aptitude in Classical Osteopathy** and respective **Diploma in Classical Osteopathy**.

Teachers are appointed by the IPOC coordinator respecting the following paragraphs:

- a) Theoretical classes take place under the guidance of one (1) previously appointed teacher.
- b) Practical classes take place under the guidance of one (1) appointed teacher and one (1) assistant teacher.
- c) For appointed teachers who, for reasons of force majeure, cannot honor their commitment, the IPOC coordinator has the right to reappoint another substitute teacher with prior notice to the students.

<u>Note:</u> all students will have access 5 days in advance of the schedule with the syllabus and teachers appointed for the seminar in question.

### **EVALUATION**

The assessment of knowledge within the scope of the curricular modules must be carried out in three components:

- a) Continuous assessment:
- b) Final work (Case Study or Bibliographic Review of a pathology, according to the principles and practice of classical osteopathy);
- c) Practical final exam in a real environment;

Within the scope of continuous assessment, the following elements must be considered, among others:

- d) Class attendance attendance in at least 85% of scheduled classes:
- e) Preparation and presentation of individual or group work on topics suggested or approved by teaching staff.
- f) Commitment to practical classes;
- g) Oral interventions;

The defense of the written work and the final practical exam take place in the 19th module after the completion of the academic part of the course, with a single period being foreseen for its completion, which comprises two calls that will take place at least thirty days apart. breaks and to which any registered student can have access.

The final grade of the course corresponds to the weighted average of the grades given in relation to the continuous assessment, final work and the final practical exam, worth 20%, 35% and 45% respectively.

All classifications are expressed on a scale of 0 to 20 values.

Students who obtain a minimum final classification of 10 out of 10 are considered approved.
